## Additional notes:

Grade VIII* (18 study weeks) is made up of students who have been admitted, after completed VII grade, to secondary schools after successfully passing admission exams. During this year they take intensive foreign language classes, the number of which prevails significantly in comparison with the number of classes assigned to the rest of the studied at this school level, subjects.

Teachers' school year: The length of the teachers' school year is defined not at central level. The decision with this regard is left to the schools' own discretion. The school head is responsible for setting and drawing up of their school's timetable. The most common situation is when the teachers, on employment contract, are required to be present and at disposal at school at the beginning of September so that they can get prepared well in advance and deal with the school documentation for the new school year.
The end of the teachers' school year is also determined at school level, if the teachers are needed to be at school in order to help, complete or close the school documentation, or if they are involved in other out-ofclass activities, school projects, initiatives, etc., they usually are supposed to stay extra days after the beginning of the summer holiday period for pupils.

## Teachers

The official school year is longer for teachers in both primary and secondary education as it includes registration days, sorting out of schools and classes and exam periods.
In primary and secondary general education according to the law, the official school year is from 1 September 2011 until the 31 August 2012.
Teachers however, need to be at school from 1 September 2011 until 30 June 2011 for school work for secondary education and from 5 September 2011 until 22 June 2012 for primary education.

The abovementioned dates for the Folkeskole are a sample from the municipality of Hørsholm ( ${ }^{1}$ ), as the dates vary slightly on a national scale. E.g. the winter/carnival holiday thus depends on the municipality which usually decides whether the holiday is in week 7 or 8 . The dates for upper secondary education are taken from Gammel Hellerup Gymnasium ( ${ }^{2}$ ).
Folkeskole, that is schools offering comprehensive primary and lower secondary education are at liberty to decide on the number of holidays and their distribution, given that they offer a minimum of 200 school days each year. The Ministry of Education determines the last day of the school year, which is the case for both primary, lower secondary and general upper secondary education. In addition, the Ministry may also issue guidelines regarding the distribution of holidays.

In practice teachers' holidays coincide with the pupils' holidays. However, teachers have their planning and INSET obligations, which they have to do during both during the school year and outside the school year.

## Additional notes:

According to the Act on Public Education, the minister responsible for education specifies the schedule of the academic year in a ministerial decree. Article 52 of the Act stipulates that the school term-time or the academic year commences on the first working day of September every year and concludes on 15 June every year or on the working day which precedes 15 June if it is not a working day. The school, while leaving the first and last school day of the academic year unchanged, may give further holidays (5 days in primary and 6 days in secondary education) to the pupils or may change the beginning and end date of the preset school holidays over the school year.

School holidays at schools teaching, using any of the languages of national or ethnic minorities of Hungary as the language of instruction, may differ from the above described school holidays to celebrate national traditions. (Source: Decree No. 30/2011 (VI. 7.) of the Minister for National Resources on the organization of school year of 2011/2012).

* Act No. XXXIII. of 1992 on the legal status of public servants and the Government Decree No. 138/1992 stipulate that the holidays of teachers primarily have to be given during the summer holiday. If not all days can be taken during that, the rest has to be provided during the autumn, winter or spring holidays. (For teachers the autumn, winter and spring holidays are workdays without teaching). Furthermore teachers have 5 days off at their disposal that they can take during the school year by their choice.

$\left({ }^{2}\right)$ School may use their own discretion to determine the precise ending of the school year in June, providing it has met the overall requirement of 183 days.
$\left({ }^{3}\right)$ Primary school may use 3 discretionary days to extend their Winter/Carnival break to an alternative option of a 5 day break.
Circular 0034/2011 sets out the standardised school breaks at primary level for the school years 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14.

## IRELAND (CONTINUED)

The arrangements for standardised closure at primary level (Circular 0034/2011) are agreed without prejudice to closure on specific days, within the overall requirement of 183 days at primary level, dictated by religious observance that is required in schools under patronage of different denominations or faiths. In the absence of an adequate number of discretionary days a school authority may choose to utilise a religious observation day for non-tuition purpose when planning the school year.
The existing arrangements for school breaks may provide some limited flexibility to schools on certain other days outside of the defined periods. The scheduling of such days must not be used to extend or modify the period set out above in respect of mid-term, Christmas and Easter breaks save where religious observance requirements of a school under a particular patronage makes this necessary.

It was not a requirement of this agreement that the commencement or end of the school year either at primary or post primary level should be standardised.

## General Secondary

In accordance with Circular M29/95, the minimum number of teaching days per post-primary school will be 167. In addition, in accordance with Circular 0034/2011, holiday periods during the school year have been standardised, i.e. midterm breaks, Christmas and Easter holidays. Traditionally, formal instruction ends in post-primary schools on the Friday preceding the June bank holiday weekend. State examinations normally commence the following Wednesday. In order for schools to meet their requirement to be open for 167 days during 2011/12 school year, it is expected that postprimary schools will be open circa 30 August 2011.

The above holidays are standardised in accordance with Circular 0034/2011. The school year at post-primary level is very tight and does not allow for any additional holidays, as schools must comply with the minimum number of 167 days. In fact, in recent years, since the standardised school calendar, many schools which would have traditionally opened on 1 September are now opening in late August in order to meet their full complement of days. There is more flexibility at primary school level, as they are not restricted by the end of year State exams.

Schools can adjust the school calendar, established by the Regions, to the POF's requirements (the POF is the basic document of the cultural and planning identity of each school. It defines the curricular, extra-curricular, educational and organisational projects of each school). Schools can organise in a flexible way the overall timetable for the curriculum and for any single subject even on the basis of multi-week planning, provided that lessons spread over a minimum of five days per week and that the prescribed annual, pluriennial or cycle number of hours for the single subjects is complied with. Generally speaking, the school year begins between the $2^{\text {nd }}$ and the $4^{\text {th }}$ week of September and finishes between the $1^{\text {st }}$ and the $3^{\text {rd }}$ week of June. The school adaptations of the school time should guarantee at least 200 days of lesson in the school year.
According to school autonomy, schools have up to 5 or 6 days available, which are foreseen for the suspension of educational activities.

A school year is divided into two parts: at the end of a semester, there is a two-week holiday, called mid-school year holiday. The summer holidays are between June and September. Decisions on ending/starting semester dates are made by the Ministry.

Additional notes: Schools must be open to pupils for at least 380 half day sessions each school year. Teachers are required to be available for five additional days, ie for 195 days in total. The actual dates on which schools operate are not laid down centrally; they are set, depending on the legal category of the school, by the local authority (LA) or school governing body.
The table shows the most common patterns for term dates and holidays. Traditionally, the school year is divided into three terms, each of which is divided into two half terms separated by a half term holiday. The dates of school holidays are normally planned to take into account and cover most national public holidays including Easter.
There is currently movement towards the adoption of a standard school year, consistent year on year. The standard school year is divided into six blocks of roughly even length which are more evenly distributed throughout the year: two, approximately seven-week blocks before Christmas, followed by four approximately six-week blocks afterwards. The spring break is taken around the first two weeks of April irrespective of the timing of Easter. A 2008 Local Government Association (LGA) survey found that, since its introduction in 2004/05, 79 local authorities out of 125 had adopted the standard school year fully or in part.

    For the General secondary education, the end of the school year comes at the end of June and includes exams, correction of papers, result announcements.

    Lower secondary education (Basic education): end of the school year for the $9^{\text {th }}$ class: 15 June 2012.
    Upper secondary education: end of the school year for the $12^{\text {th }}$ class: 22 June 2012.
    The school year is divided in two semesters: the first from 1 September to 23 December 2011 and the second from 9 January to 31 May 2012 (or 15 June for the $9^{\text {th }}$ class and 22 June for the $12^{\text {th }}$ class).
    Extension of the school year for classes 1-8 and 10-11 may be made if specific circumstances hindering education process arise during the school year (e.g. extreme temperature, strike, emergency situation in school, etc.).
    Education institutions decide when to carry out a 1 week long project week in the second semester.
    Holidays (summer 2012): These are the dates for the official summer holiday period for classes 1-8 and 10-11. For the $1^{\text {st }}$ class, education institutions decide on additional holidays of 1 week in the second semester (usually before Easter).
    Public holidays: When the specific holidays of November 18 and May 4 fall on Saturday or Sunday, the holiday is transferred to the next working day.
    Teachers: The teachers' school year concurs fully with students' year, but normally is longer and starts earlier, though the end and the start date is not defined officially. Teachers have the right to receive 8 weeks of paid annual leave in summer.

    Half-yearly Examinations take place between 7 and 17 February 2012 for secondary school students and between 14 and 16 February 2012 for primary school pupils.
    The Annual Examinations take place between 12 and 27 June 2012 for secondary school students and between 25 and 27 June 2012 for primary school pupils.
    Students of year 6 in the Primary sit for Benchmark Exams held on the 4, 5, 6 June and Orals held on 11 and 12 of June 2012.

    On 16, 19 and 20 September 2011 and on 9, 10 and 11 July 2012, teachers who are called to do so, attend in-service training (INSET) courses.
    Dates for summer holidays indicated are for students. Teachers start their holidays later and start the school year earlier than students.

New Year's Day, Ascension and Christmas Day are the only holidays all cantons have in common. In most cantons Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday and Boxing Day are also official holidays.

Optional days are intended to cover closings throughout the year in special circumstances, for example the death of a person connected with the school, the need to move premises, the start of building work at the school or church holy days. These optional days are therefore likely to differ from school to school.
